







What is a patent?

- A patent is a negative right
- A patent is the right to exclude others from
 - making
 - using
 - offering for sale
 - selling
 - or importing

the patented invention for a limited period of time in a certain geography



A patent

- Has to be applied for
- Has to be granted
- Has to be valid (max. lifetime 20 years, renewal fees)
- Has to be valid in a certain territory



Let's assume:

You are during a R&D-project and would like to do a first FTO-analysis

- What would you do?
- Where would you search?
- You found a patent with very similar claims

Is this the end?

Not neccessarily!




A patent

- Has to be applied for
- Has to be granted
- Has to be valid (max. lifetime 20 years, renewal fees)
- Has to be valid in a certain territory

18 months after filing, a patent (application) will be made public (appear in databases, such as Espacenet) – regardless of the legal status (if not withdrawn before)



Off all solutions found in patent documents



You can find many great solutions for free!



FTO-analysis

Before: search for any 3rd party IP-rights which can block your commercial activities

More precisely: search for any valid 3rd party IP-rights which can block your commercial activities in a certain geography

Business Strategy!



When would you do a FTO-analysis?

- Eg. before the start of a R&D-project (investment)

Remember: Patent protection for a new product



When can a patent be granted?

- New
- Inventive
- Commercially applicable



FTO versus Patentability la

Let's assume:

- You conducted a FTO-search before the start of a R&D-project
- You found a patent with very similar claims (not expired, valid in Japan only)
- Your business strategy: doing business in Europe









Strategic question: Would you start the R&D-project, already knowing that you cannot get IP protection?



FTO versus Patentability Ib

Let's assume:

- You conducted a FTO-search before the start of a R&D-project
- You found a patent with very similar claims (<u>expired patent</u>, was valid in Japan only)
- Your business strategy: doing business in Europe









Strategic question: Would you start the R&D-project, already knowing that you cannot get IP protection?



FTO versus Patentability II

Let's assume:

- You have a new idea: computer mouse which needs no cable or battery –
 it generates its electricity by the movement of the mouse
- Search: let's assume: you found no patent on this specific idea (valid or expired / no application)




The invention relates to a computer mouse (1) for wireless operation of a computer system. A power supply for the computer mouse (1) is provided without the use of rechargeable batteries or batteries. For this purpose, the computer mouse (1) has a dynamo (2) and an energy storage device (3). By actuating the dynamo (2), energy is generated which is temporarily stored in the energy storage device (3).






Ongoing Patent Monitoring

- Keep IP monitoring updated (FTO and technology/competitor watch)
- Keep in mind timing of events:









Possible Strategies

Let's assume:

- You did a FTO-search just before the end of the successful R&D-project
- You found a very similar European patent (you want to do business in EU)
- The patent is valid in main EU-member states

Your options:



- Wait for patent to expire
- Modify product / design around
- Move commercial activities (outside validated territories)
- Get a license (cross-licensing), buy patent (M&A)
- Try to invalidate 3rd party's patent
- Abandon R&D-project
